

About the International Conference





Abstract Submission guidelines

- 1.Participants first need to pay the registration fees and then have to upload their abstract in the google form along with other information.
- 2. The original typescript and well formatted abstract should be uploaded as a comprehensive MS Word file, with 2.5 cm margins. The text should be in 1.5 line spacing in 'Times New Roman' font with font size of 12. The word limit should be 300 words.
- 3. Abstract should include Title, Full Names and Affiliation of authors and the e-mail ID of the presenting/corresponding author. The name of the presenting author should be underlined and the name of the corresponding author should bear a star '*'.
- 4. Abstract should not include any figure, graph, table in the text. Abstract should include 4-5 keywords. References, if required, not more than three in number and they should be added at the end of abstract text, only in APA format.
- 5. The abstracts will be evaluated by a scientific committee for the mode of presentation (oral/poster). In case of more entries and quality of the abstract, your mode of presentation may be changed by the committee.
- 6. Abstracts having plagiarism will be rejected and the participant will be barred from the conference.
- 7. It is mandatory to submit the abstract for academicians and research scholars. Last date for abstract submission is 20 June, 2024. A softcopy of e-proceeding book with ISSN Number will be provided to registered participants.


Guidelines for Participants:

Poster or E-poster Presentation: You are required to prepare one poster (standard size 3 feet by 4 feet), containing graphical abstract and significant finding.

Best Paper Presentation Award

The oral and poster presentations will be evaluated by experts for the scientific content, slides preparation, presentation skills and discussion, scientific merit, novelty of work, explanation and relevance of results. The oral and poster awards will be announced and presented in the closing session of the conference.



About Dr Harisingh Gour Vishwavidyalaya

Pt. Jawaharlal Nehru inaugurated the university in the year 1946 and it is said that he came up with the phrase 'Switzerland of Madhya Pradesh', as he viewed the town of Sagar from the premises of the University. Ever since the town has been popular among leaders of the country and was also included in the much-anticipated Smart Cities Mission of PM Narendra Modi.

Doctor Harisingh Gour Vishwavidyalaya Sagar (A Central University), formerly University of Saugor, was established on 18th July 1946 by Dr. Sir Hari Singh Gour (Nov. 26, 1870 - Dec. 25, 1949). This 18th University of India and the oldest and the biggest University of Madhya Pradesh Dr. Hari Singh Gour was the first Vice-Chancellor of University of Delhi (1922 to 1926) and first Dean (1924) of The Faculty of Law in the University of Delhi. Dr. Hari Singh Gour also held the position of Vice-Chancellor of the Nagpur University, (two times in 1928 and 1936). Dr. Gour was the founder Vice-Chancellor of the Sagar University (1946). The Govt. of India honored his memory by issuing a commemorative postage stamp in 1976. The University rechristened as Doctor Hari Singh Vishwavidyalaya in February 1983 by the State Legislature. The University is situated 5 Km east of Sagar city and its campus covers an area of 1312.89 acres over Pathariya hills connected to the Vindhya Range, surrounded by lush green forest (about 100 acres) within its campus and has effectively contributed to the maintenance and preservation of ecosystem and its biodiversity. It is one of the finest picturesque campuses in India. The alumni of the University are occupying outstanding positions and are globally known for their achievements, most distinguished among them is Late Shri Rajnish Jain, popularly known as "OSHO".



Discover Madhya Pradesh "The Heart of India" About Sagar (The Switzerland of Madhya Pradesh, India)

Geographically, almost in the center of India is the small town of Sagar, a quaint little town situated along the Vindhya Range and replete with water bodies. Owing to the location, Sagar holds a plethora of opportunities for tourists to have quick weekend getaways. Some of the must-visit places around Sagar include Gadpedha The Lost castle and Abchand Caves in Sagar; Khajurao, The UNESCO WORLD Heritage Centre; Bhopal: City of Lakes, Sanchi Stupa, Pacchmarhi Hill station; Jabalpur: Bheda Ghat, Bargi Hills, Nidan Falls, Bandhavgarh National Park, Kanha National Park; Nauradehi: Witness the wild, it is one of the biggest wildlife reserves in India in terms of landmass. How to Reach Sagar

- 1. By Air The nearest Domestic Airport is Dumna Airport, Jabalpur roughly four hour drive from Sagar. The second nearest Domestic Airport is Raja Bhoj Airport, Bhopal, 200 Kms from the city.
- 2. By Rail -It has its own Railway Station named as Saugor Railway Station which is connected to the major cities of Madhya Pradesh.
- 3. Sagar is best connected to New Delhi via trains:

Jabalpur-Nizamuddin Gondwana Express (22182) starts from Nizamuddin (Delhi) at 17:45 and reaches Sagar by 03:00-04:00 AM. (Runs Daily)

Madhya Pradesh S Kranti Express (12122) starts from Nizamuddin (Delhi) at 17:55 and reaches Sagar by 03:00-04:00 AM. (Runs on Mon, Thu and Sat)

Hazrat Nizamuddin-Chhattisgarh S Kranti Express (12824) starts from Nizamuddin (Delhi) at 17:55 and reaches Sagar by 03:00-04:00 AM. (Runs on Tue, Fri and Sun)
